SENIOR FOCUS ON SENIOR COMMUNITY SERVICE EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (SCSEP)



SCSEP

The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) provides opportunities for seniors to return to or enter for the first time the competitive job market through work experience and job training.

Non-profit community service organizations throughout the City provide training that assist seniors attain the confidence and skills needed to transition into unsubsidized employment.

SCSEP is a mandated partner in the City of Los Angeles WorkSource Centers system. These are community job resource centers located throughout the City and provide a wide array of services to job seekers and employers.

Who Qualifies?

Applicants who are:

1. Age 55 or older;
2. Residents of the City of Los Angeles;
3. Within Federal low-income guidelines; and
4. Unemployed.

What is the Training Experience?

Participants train for 20 hours per week while earning a stipend in a supportive environment with a community service organization near their neighborhood.

Community service organizations are program partners and provide training and work experience to prepare participants for employment in the variety of industries that make-up the diverse economic base of Los Angeles.

Participants have found jobs in:

- Finance and Business Services
- Health Services
- Tourism and Entertainment
- Electronics and Apparel Manufacturing
- Retail and Wholesale Distribution
